Total semester hours required for graduation for Nursing majors: 125

- Cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA): 2.50, Nsg GPA: 2.50, Sci GPA: 2.50 to be eligible to apply for admission, progression GPA must be maintained to progress and graduate.
- Grades of at least a C are required for BIO 201 & 201L and BIO 202 & 202L and all courses in the Nursing major for uninterrupted progression.
- \*\*One course in language is required if you have less than two levels of high school language with grade of C or better. If language must be taken to meet the proficiency requirement, the course may be taken in place of elective(s). Statistics, which is required, does meet the math requirement.
- If English Essentials or Basic Chemistry is required, it is in addition to the total listed above.
- The above schedule of courses represent courses that should be taken each year, but variations in schedules are expected and are desirable.

### **Junior Year Transfer Option - with Summer school**

- N203 is the first clinical course in the Nursing Major and is a prerequisite to all subsequent clinical nursing courses. The following are prerequisites or co-requisites to N203; N101, Nutrition, Dev. Psych Across the Lifespan, Anatomy and Physiology, Microbiology. Admission to the Nursing Major and Certification in CPR and First Aid are also required before beginning N203.
- Transfer students seeking junior year status should obtain information about the summer transfer program (consisting of N101 during summer school, N203 beginning in late July and N102 and N207 concurrent with Spring Junior year courses.) To be eligible for this program, the transfer student must have completed the Nutrition, Developmental Psychology, Microbiology and Anatomy and Physiology requirements.
- Completion of the Chemistry requirement is a prerequisite to the Junior nursing courses, N301 and N303.
