Academic Probation Policy

Note: If it is determined a student is not meeting the academic or behavioral expectations of Roberts Wesleyan College, including but not limited to instances of cheating or plagiarism, they will be dismissed by the college according to college procedures. This policy pertains solely to the academic expectations required of enrolled ELI students.

If it is determined a student is not meeting the academic expectations of course and level specific SLOs through their performance on course assessments, the student will be contacted by the Director of the ELI. The probation process will occur as follows:

- Once determined to not be meeting the academic expectations required of the student as described above, the student will be required to meet with the Director of the ELI. The student will be informed that they are on probation. The Director, in conjunction with course instructors and the student, will determine an expected level of academic growth and other criteria required by the student over a given time period to complete in order to get off of probation.
- After given time period, the student will be reevaluated.
 - If the student is determined to have made an acceptable level of growth and has met other criteria put forth, the student will be off of probation.
 - If the student has not made acceptable growth and/or has not met other criteria put forth, the student will enter the final probation period. The student will again be informed of expected level of academic growth and other criteria required for the student to get off of final probation in given time period.
- After given time period, the student will be evaluated for the final time.
 - If the student has not made adequate growth and/or has not met the required criteria, the student will be dismissed from the ELI.
 - If the student has made adequate growth and has met required criteria, the Director of the ELI will determine a continued probationary plan and reevaluation for the student.

Students who enter into probation within the ELI may only go through the process **ONCE**. If the student, after successfully exiting probation the first time, is determined to meet the criteria for probation again, that student will be automatically dismissed from the ELI.
