Bc he was a close friend of mine and it was a mistake that won't happen again.
Didn't affect me and wasn't bad
Didn't want to get parents involved
Didn't want people to know, I invited him over
didnt think it was a big deal, didnt want him to hate me
I didn't remember how to. The first time I tried reporting an incident two years ago, Dr. Aube said that she didn't think I should report it so I didn't want someone to tell me that again after I was vulnerable enough to talk about the incident.
Judgment from the schools administration or faculty, the word possibly spreading about my experience in this small school, the fear of the school making rules more “stricter” when it comes to visiting hours in the dorm or other related rules after hearing about my experience, I didnt know who exactly to talk to or where to go to talk about this, a closer eye on me from security/faculty including less freedom while living here, and feelings that I wouldn't be believed because I don't have proof. I was also threatened by the guy that if I were to tell someone or he get in trouble for this that he would have his friends come after me (hurt or rape me) and I am extremely terrified.
