

# US Healthcare and New York State of Health (NYSOH) Insurance FAQs

## What does the NYSOH insurance cover?

Doctor's appointments, dental cleanings, eye exams, one pair of glasses every two years, Covid test, Covid vaccine, specialists, counseling, prescriptions, ambulances, hospital stays, and more!

## How do I get a new insurance card if lost?

Call the customer service number for the insurance you have and follow the prompts to request a new card.

## How do I find out if my insurance card is active?

## Can I keep my NYSOH Insurance after graduating?

If you are staying in New York state, we recommend it. Just remember to renew annually.

## How do I get a Primary Care Provider (PCP)?

1. We recommend [Churchville-Chili Family Medicine](#) because it is within walking distance of campus and they have multiple doctors on staff so they are usually accepting new patients.
2. Go to the website and fill out New Patient forms before scheduling your first appointment.
3. Once you have established them as your PCP, call your insurance provider so they can update your card and mail you a new one.
4. If you do not choose your own PCP, your insurance provider will assign one and it may be much further from campus.

## **Can I get a COVID-19 vaccine in New York as an international student?**

Everyone over the age of 16 is now eligible to get a vaccine in NY and many locations are available to simply walk-in. Find open appointments near your home or near campus [here](#). You can find out more about locations for walk-in appointments [here](#). As a reminder, vaccines are free and do not require you to provide evidence of health insurance coverage.

**If you are a student currently living on campus**, if you need proof of residency, you may stop by the Office of Student Life to pick up a letter affirming your residency on campus.
